

Warm water pools help muscles to relax and can assist with pain relief in muscle and joints, helping also with muscle tone problems such as tight or weak muscles. The therapeutic properties of water help to improve balance, coordination, strength and flexibility. Massage jets in the pool can assist in pain relief in chronic/acute conditions such as back pain and arthritis. Ceiling hoists are provided in the changing rooms and a pool hoist provides access into the pool, enabling the pool to be fully accessible for wheelchair users and individuals with compromised mobility.

Travelling through Dublin Airport

Many individuals with autism can find travelling through the airport a very difficult and scary experience. For many individuals it represents a new experience which is difficult to understand and sometimes very frightening. Below are a number of simple strategies that can be employed to help the individual with ASD to understand the process of getting through the airport.

Sensory Room and where is it?

A purpose-built sensory room is available for passengers involved with our special assistance programme and is and open 24 hours a day. It is located after security screening in Terminal 2 and just before the 400 boarding gates. It can be also be accessed via Terminal 1.

'Important Flyer' wristband/lanyard

Dublin Airport can provide a wristband or lanyard for travelling through Dublin Airport. It can be shown to any Dublin Airport staff member (Customer Care and Security screening for example) if assistance is required at security, passport control or any area where you may encounter queues or crowds. Visuals and further information about travelling through the airport is included on the website

(Although this service refers only to Autism they will provide support to children with high sensory needs or difficulties)

At Shannon Airport, they have created an awareness programme for your children with special needs to help them understand the process of getting through the Airport as quickly and as smoothly, by providing baseball caps and wristbands. This way, staff can identify anyone who may need a bit extra guidance and help them on their way.

Sensory Room and where is it?
